



Spectator information

Doors open at 6.15pm

Play starts at 7pm

Play starts at 7pm on both Thursday 26th and Friday 27th January. The venue will be open throughout the day, but we will not be admitting any spectators into the arena until 45 minutes prior to the first match being played.

With the exception of Group Bookings (which will be clearly marked on seats), all seating is unallocated. There is a chance that both days will be a sell-out, so please ensure you do not leave any gaps in the seating. If gaps are left, spectators may be asked to move, in order to allow everyone into the venue.

Please allow plenty of time to check in and find your seats, doors open at 6.15pm and there may be queues.

Tickets

You will need the e-ticket that has been emailed to you by Table Tennis England - this can be on your phone or printed. You will be issued with a wristband on arrival to give you access to the arena throughout the evening. If you have not yet received your ticket, please check the junk or spam folders of your email address. If you still are unable to locate the ticket email, please contact help@tabletennisengland.co.uk.

If you have purchased a family ticket, all members of the family must present themselves at the arena entrance at the same time. If you have purchased a number of tickets for a group,

your party does not need to arrive together, providing they each hold their own unique ticket with the QR code to be scanned. Children must be accompanied by an adult.

If you have purchased a two-day ticket, you will need to bring the same ticket on both days, as this will be scanned on both days.

If there are tickets still available on the evening of the event, these will be available to purchase at the Box Office by the entrance to the arena. Please check the Table Tennis England website for availability information.

Accessibility

Refreshments

There are catering facilities serving both hot and cold drinks and food on the ground floor, as well as a bar on the first floor before heading into the arena.

The café will close at 7.30pm on both days, but hot food will stop being served at 6.30pm.

The bar will be open from 5-10pm on both days. There will be a small range of hot snacks on the bar, and cold items in the fridge such as sandwiches, pasta etc.

Cashless venue

The venue and event will be a cashless event, so any tickets, merchandise or refreshments purchased at the café or bar on the day can only be paid for by card.

Getting to the venue

The address of the venue is K2 Crawley, Pease Pottage Hill, Crawley, RH11 9BQ. Please note, there is often heavy traffic in and around the area.

By Car

From the M25, exit at junction 7, to take the M23(S) exit to Brighton/Crawley/Gatwick Airport. Merge on to the M23. At junction 11, take the exit to Horsham/Pease Pottage Services. At the interchange, take the 4th exit on to Brighton Rd/A23. The entrance to K2 Crawley is off the A23, Pease Pottage Hill, on the right-hand side.

From Brighton, take the A23 to Crawley. At Pease Pottage Interchange, junction 11, take the 2nd exit on to Brighton Rd/A23. The entrance to K2 Crawley is off the A23, Pease Pottage Hill, on the right-hand side.

By Train

The closest stations are Three Bridges (2.5miles) and Crawley (1.6miles). At both stations, there is a taxi rank and usually taxis available.

Parking

The venue has ample car parking, free of charge. There will be parking marshals in the hours leading up to the match, so please follow their instructions to ensure everyone can get in and parked as quickly and smoothly as possible.
