## Tournament Information

1. All entries must be sent and received by the Tournament Organiser by the closing date.
2. **Entries can only be submitted with full payment of entry fees. Entries will not be acknowledged until both entry form and payment have been received.**
3. **There will be a practical limit for entrants and entries to specific events. It may not be possible to accept all entries. This will be determined by when your entry is submitted and paid for and by the category in which you have entered. All entries should be considered provisional until confirmed by the referee, and any unsuccessful entries will be contacted at the soonest possibility and entry fees will be refunded.**  
If it becomes necessary to restrict entries, priority will be given in order of receipt.
4. Playing Conditions – Play throughout will be on 16 x Butterfly Europa 25 tables, Butterfly nets and posts, the match ball will be Butterfly R40 3\* plastic ball (white). Individual court size 10m x 5m minimum enclosed by surrounds. Scoring machines will be used for all matches. The hall dimensions are 37 metres x 26 metres. The arena surface is a wooden sprung floor, Lighting is 10 metres from the floor LED lighting 700 LUX.
5. Changing – Facilities are available at the playing venue.
6. Practice – There are no separate practice facilities. Unused tables may be allocated to practice.
7. The tournament is included in the Computer Ranking Scheme.
8. The tournament is held under TTE regulations and is a Category A tournament regulated by TTE", with Table Tennis Wales being the promoting and delivering body.
9. All entries and event details are subject to COVID-related restrictions, or protocols that Table Tennis England may deem necessary. Venues used for events may impose COVID restrictions that go beyond government guidance.
10. Doping – Doping shall not take place either before or during play. Doping control tests may take place. The UK Anti-Doping Rules apply to all participants of the sport, including Minors, and they make all participants subject to drug Testing. For the purposes of those rules, consent of a parent or guardian to the Testing of a Minor is deemed to follow automatically from the fact that the Minor has been permitted by their parent or guardian to participate in Table Tennis. Therefore, any Minors participating in the sport may be subject to drug Testing.  
Retirement from competitions – all records relating to an athlete's retirement will be kept by Table Tennis Wales and shared with UKAD when requested.
11. Notification – Entrants will be notified of the time of their first match on each day by e-mail.
12. There is no admission charge to enter the playing venue.
13. Car parking is available at the University.

14. There is no onsite catering. There are vending machines around the sports facility, there are local food stores and café's just across the road from the Venue, approx. 5 minutes walk.
15. P.A. System – All matches will be announced on the P.A. system. Players must not leave the centre without permission of the Referee. Repeat calls for a player will be limited to three per day.
16. Player Number – A £10 deposit is included on the entry form. This will be refunded when the referee is satisfied that the player has carried out any umpiring duties required under regulation 5. Please note players will be required to complete a short refund form to gain their refund. Players must complete this on the day of competition to gain their player deposit refund.
17. Refunds for entries will only be issued to players who have withdrawn in the below time scale.
  - Prior to the deadline date – Full refund minus £5 admin Charge
  - After the deadline date and prior to the draw date – Full refund minus £10 admin charge
  - After the draw there will be no refunds available.

## Categories and Entry Fees

Players can compete in the below categories across the weekend. The first event that you enter will cost £40, of which £10 of this is a deposit which is refundable (outlined in Tournament Information #12). Each additional category that you enter will cost £12 each.

## Tournament Regulations

1. Every entrant must be affiliated as a Compete Plus Member or provide proof of being a member of another National Association affiliated to the ITTF. An entrant who is not a TTE member or is affiliated as a Supporter or Club Play Member may alternately purchase a One-Off Tournament Pass at the time of entry via <https://tabletennisengland.sport80.com/> An entrant only affiliated as a Compete member may enter the tournament upon payment of the appropriate One-Time Tournament Top-Up fee via <https://tabletennisengland.sport80.com/> It is not possible to obtain the OTTP or the OTTT at the tournament.
2. TTE Regulations Part A (Regulated Competitions) and Part B (Tournament Regulations) apply to the tournament
3. ITTF Regulations for International Competitions apply to the tournament except where otherwise specified in TTE Regulations Parts A or B, or in this form
4. Completion and submission of this Entry Form signifies agreement by the entrant to the conditions of the competition, including any variations of ITTF regulations
5. Players will be expected to umpire group matches; players may also be asked to umpire in the knockout round(s) if required.
6. All matches will be the best of 5 games. Play throughout will be in groups of four for men and women (At the Referee's discretion, banded singles events may be played in groups of three) with the first two players qualifying. The final order in a group shall be determined as per ITTF regulation 3.7.5 for group competitions except that where a player concedes a match, he/she shall receive -3 group points (x).
7. Competitors in Veteran events must have been born before 1<sup>st</sup> January 1985, competitors in Under 21 events must be born after 31<sup>st</sup> December 2003. Competitors in Restricted events must be born from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1985 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2003 inclusive.
8. Playing clothing shall consist of a shirt and shorts, trousers, leggings or skirt, or a one-part sports outfit, socks and playing shoes; a sports hijab may also be worn. Other garments shall not be worn during play except with the permission of the referee. ITTF 3.2.2.1 amended. The main colour of a shirt, shorts, trousers or skirt, other than sleeves and collar of a shirt, shall be clearly different from that of the ball in use. ITTF 3.2.2.2 amended. Markings or trimming on the front or side of a playing garment and objects such as jewellery worn by a player shall not be so conspicuous or brightly reflecting as to unsight an opponent. ITTF 3.2.2.5.
9. Competitors will be permitted to practice on tables not in use at the discretion of the Referee.
10. No competitor or official shall engage in betting on players or matches.
11. All competitors must report to the control table on arrival and must not leave the venue without first obtaining permission from the Referee.
12. Entry to banded events are restricted by player's ratings, according to the Table Tennis England Ratings List current at the closing date for entries. Restrictions are as follows:

Players may enter their own band and/or the one above. The organising committee reserves the right to give dummy ratings to any entrant who does not appear on the current Table Tennis England Ratings list. (Dummy ratings are for tournament purposes only, players will have zero points on the

ratings list unless they are in the top 30% of the ITTF World Ranking List. Players with an existing rating can also be given a dummy rating to be more reflective of ability)

Banded Events – If you do not have a Table Tennis England Rating, in most cases you will qualify for Band 6 (Men) Band 4 (Women). Remember, you are entitled to play in your own Band and/or the one above.

**IMPORTANT:** the level of the event at which a player gains their initial rating may constrain the potential value of that initial rating. If an unrated player is experienced and capable, as opposed to a beginner, it is important to a) ensure the event is the correct level in order that the initial rating is gained against opponents of an appropriate rating, and b) actively liaise with the Referee of the event to ensure that the unrated players' event seeding/ banding/ grouping is appropriate. If an event entry form does not include the ability to state this information, it is recommended that an unrated player contact the Referee directly prior to the event draw. Failure to do so may result in an undervalued initial rating, although this will normalise with further competition.

13. Should there be insufficient entries in any event, the Referee reserves the right to cancel/merge such event and/or place the entrants in a similar event. Table Tennis Wales reserves the right to reduce the prize money in the Men's and Women's singles should entries fall below 16 per specific event and would be proportional to the entry size.
14. The use of rackets prepared with glue containing VOCs will not be allowed.
15. The Referee's decision shall be final on points of law on any question arising not provided for in these regulations or in any dispute as to the interpretation thereof. Decisions on points of fact by an umpire or assistant umpire appointed by the Referee shall be final.
16. Any UK earnings/ tax implications, and/ or UK visa implications, arising from prize winnings at this event are strictly the responsibility of the participant.
