TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS (to be retained)

1Every entrant must be affiliated as a Compete Plus Member or provide proof of being a member of another National Association affiliated to the ITTF. An entrant only affiliated as a Compete member may enter the tournament upon payment of the appropriate One-Time Tournament Top-Up fee via https://tabletennisengland.sport80.com/ It is not possible to obtain the OTTT at the tournament.

- 2. TTE Regulations Part A (Regulated Competitions) and Part B (Tournament Regulations) apply to the tournament.
- 3. ITTF Regulations for International Competitions apply to the tournament except where otherwise specified in TTE Regulations Parts A or B, or in this form.
- 4. Completion and submission of this Entry Form signifies agreement by the entrant to the conditions of the competition including any variations of ITTF regulations.
- 5. Competitors may be expected to umpire group matches at the discretion of the Referee.
- 6. All matches shall be the best of five games to eleven points. Play throughout will be on a knockout basis with the exception of preliminary rounds which may, at the discretion of the Referee, be on a group basis. The final order in a group shall be determined as per ITTF Regulation 3.7.5. for Group competitions.
- 7. Competitors in Under 13 must be born in 2013 or later, Under 15 must be born in 2011 or later Under 17th must be born in 2009 or later and Junior must be born in 2007 or later
- 8. Playing clothing shall consist of a shirt and shorts, trousers, leggings or skirt, or a one-part sports outfit, socks and playing shoes; a sports hijab may also be worn. Other garments shall not be worn during play except with the permission of the referee. ITTF 3.2.2.1 amended. The main colour of a shirt, shorts, trousers or skirt, other than sleeves and collar of a shirt, shall be clearly different from that of the ball in use. ITTF 3.2.2.2 amended. Markings or trimming on the front or side of a playing garment and objects such as jewellery worn by a player shall not be so conspicuous or brightly reflecting as to unsight an opponent. ITTF 3.2.2.5
- 9. No competitor or official shall engage in betting on players or matches.
- 10. Doping shall not take place either before or during play.
- 11. All competitors must report to the Control Desk on arrival and must not leave the hall without first obtaining permission from the Referee. Players absent when called upon to play are liable to be scratched.
- 12. Should there be insufficient entries in any event the Referee reserves the right to cancel that event/merge such event and/or place the entrant in a similar event.
- 13. The Referee's decision shall be final on points of law, and any question arising not provided for in these regulations, or in any dispute as to the interpretation thereof. Decisions on points of fact by an umpire or assistant umpire appointed by the Referee shall be final
- 14. Racket testing may take place.

15. No refunds will be given after the Closing Date

- 16. All entries and event details are subject to COVID-related restrictions, or protocols that Table Tennis England may deem necessary. Venues used for events may impose COVID restrictions that go beyond government guidance.
- 17. All participants and attendees at Table Tennis England events are subject to Table Tennis England Codes of Conduct. Please see https://www.tabletennisengland.co.uk/about-us/safeguarding/safeguarding-codes-of-conduct-and-terms-of-reference/
- 18. TTE, the Organisers and the Referee will not tolerate bad language or verbal abuse of volunteers, officials, staff or venue staff, nor a failure to follow the operational directions of stewards and event staff. We will treat all such instances extremely seriously and will take disciplinary action if necessary. TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

- 2. Draw The draw will take place on **19th November 2025 at 11 Ward Drive st. Neots PE190AP**. Once completed, and before the date of the tournament, the draw will be put on the social media and TTE webpage.
- 3. Admission There will be no charge for admission.
- 4. Playing Conditions Play throughout will be on 18 Butterfly Europa 25 tables, nets & posts, **Butterfly R40 White plastic Seamless balls**, wooden sprung floor and general LED 700 lux lighting 18m above the floor. Court size will be 12m x 6m and 20m from the floor to the ceiling enclosed by surrounds. Butterfly Scoring machines will be used for all matches.
- 5. Doping Doping control tests may take place.
- 6. Practice There will be no separate practice facilities. Competitors will be permitted to practice on tables not in use at the discretion of the Referee.
- 7. Refreshments will be on sale throughout serving breakfast, lunch and tea.
- 9. Medals will be presented to winners and runners up in every event.
- 10. Changing rooms are available on site with men's, women's and disabled.
- 11. Car Parking Car parking (at owner's risk) is available at the venue in Car Park 8 Free of charge.

Door will open at 8am both days.

4-star Criteria for Nationals 2025/2026

There are six Cadet & Junior 4* events scheduled for 25/26, with four taking place in the window that will contribute to qualification for the Cadet National Championships and five in respect of Junior National Championships 2026, as follows:

27-28 Sept: Cleveland 4*

25-26 Oct: London Academy 4*

22-23 Nov: Blackpool 4*

· 06-07 Dec: Cambridge 4*

03-04 Jan: Chandlers 4*

• Cadet National Championships invites based on January ranking run (Published 14 Jan) – eligibility play 2 of 5

14-15 Feb: Plymouth 4*

07-08 Mar: Cadet & U17s National Champs

- Junior National Championships invites based on March ranking run (Published 11 March) – eligibility play 2 of 6
- 16-17 May: Junior & U21 National Champs

Invitations will be issued on the following basis:

- 1. All invitees to Cadet National Championships and Junior National Championships 2026 must participate in at least 2x designated 4* events, notwithstanding mitigating circumstances
- 2. Invitations will be issued to 20 from ranking list + 10 qualifying from 4* events + 2 wildcards (that will default to qualifiers if unused)
- 3. All boy's and girl's Cadet and Junior 4* winners will receive an automatic invitation if they meet the 2x 4* entry requirement







4. Thereafter, qualifiers determined by 'leader-board' approach; no points (except those for entering) are available for consolation events

o Enter: 1 point

o Main QF: +1 point (2 total)

o Main SF: +1 point (3 total)

o Main R/up: +1 point (4 total)

o Main Winner: +2 points (5 total; automatic qualification)

Please note that eligibility/ qualifying invites/ leaderboard for Cadet National Championships will include Chandlers 4*, but event results will not be reflected in the national rankings until February.
