#### 1 Name, revocation and replacement

- (1) These Regulations are known as Part P: Anti-Doping Regulations having been enacted and come into force on 17 October 2025.
- (2) These Regulations replace and revoke the Regulations Part P: Anti-Doping Regulations dated 2 February 2023.

#### 2 Application

These Regulations apply to all affiliated members of Table Tennis England ('TTE').

#### 3 Interpretation

The following terms as defined apply to these Regulations, unless stated otherwise:

- (a) Affiliated Member means an individual affiliated to TTE.
- (b) Athletes any affiliated member of Table Tennis England regardless of what level you participate at.
- (c) Athlete Support Personnel those that understand the importance of what anti-doping means, and take pride in their athletes being clean, is the role of the athlete support team.
- (d) Table Tennis England jurisdiction Great Britain Table Tennis Limited, Table Tennis England, Table Tennis Scotland, Table Tennis Wales and Table Tennis Ireland (Ulster Branch)

#### **4 Requirements**

- 4.1 The anti-doping regulations of Table Tennis England are the UK Anti-Doping Rules published by UK Anti-Doping (or its successor), as amended from time to time. Such rules shall take effect and be construed as TTE Regulations with the addition of the supplemental provision set out in 4 below.
- 4.2 These regulations are binding on all Athletes, Athlete Support Personnel, and other Persons under Table Tennis England jurisdiction.
- 4.3 It is a disciplinary offence for any person under Table Tennis England jurisdiction: a) to fail or refuse (without compelling justification) to cooperate with any Code-compliant anti-doping investigation or proceedings, b) to commit an act of misconduct related to anti-doping which does not amount to an Anti-Doping Rule Violation, and appropriate action will be taken where necessary.
- 4.4 It is acknowledged that there is an agreement in place between Great Britain Table Tennis Limited, Table Tennis England, Table Tennis Scotland, Table Tennis Wales and Table Tennis Ireland (Ulster Branch) that Team GB Athletes will be subject to the jurisdiction of TTE whilst acting in their capacity as Team GB members, but that the result management process and investigation of possible anti-doping rule violations arising out of such Testing (including as to the conduct of any hearing and the imposition of any applicable sanctions) will be governed by and conducted in accordance with the anti-doping rules of the national governing body for the sport of table tennis in the country to which the Team GB Athlete is affiliated. For the avoidance of doubt, all Team GB Athletes therefore agree to submit to TTE jurisdiction for the purposes of Testing of Team GB members only and acknowledge that the result management process following such Testing will be conducted, in the case of a Team GB Athlete who is a member of:
- 4.4.1 English Table Tennis, by Table Tennis England in accordance with the TTE anti-doping regulations;
- 4.4.2 Scottish Table Tennis, by Table Tennis Scotland in accordance with the Table Tennis Scotland anti-doping regulations;
- 4.4.3 Welsh Table Tennis, by Table Tennis Wales in accordance with the Table Tennis Wales antidoping regulations;
- 4.4.4 Northern Ireland Table Tennis, by Table Tennis Ireland (Ulster Branch) in accordance with the Table Tennis Ireland (Ulster Branch) anti-doping regulations.
