Tournament Regulations

1. Every entrant must be affiliated as a Compete Plus Member or provide proof of being a member of another National Association affiliated to the ITTF and pay the appropriate fee in order to gain a reciprocal membership. An entrant who is not a TTE member or is affiliated as a Supporter or Club Play Member may alternately purchase a One-Off Tournament Pass at the time of entry via <https://tabletennisengland.sport80.com/> once this product is launched. An entrant only affiliated as a Compete member may enter the tournament upon payment of the appropriate One- Time Tournament Top-Up fee via <https://tabletennisengland.sport80.com/> It is not possible to obtain the OTTP or the OTTT at the tournament.
2. TTE Regulations Part A (Regulated Competitions) and Part B (Tournament Regulations) apply to the tournament.
3. ITTF Regulations for International Competitions apply to the tournament except where otherwise specified in TTE Regulations Parts A or B, or in this form.
4. Completion and submission of this Entry Form signifies agreement by the entrant to the conditions of the competition. including any variations of ITTF regulations and must be sent to welchm48@gmail.com Full payment at point of entry will be required to secure your entry. Entries received with no payment will not be entered.
5. **There will be no refunds after the closing date.**
6. All matches shall be the best of five games to eleven points. Play throughout will be on a knockout basis except for preliminary rounds which, at the discretion of the Referee, will be on a group basis. The final order in a group shall be determined as per ITTF regulation 3.7.5 for group competitions.
7. Players will be expected to umpire group matches.
8. **Competitors in Junior events must have been born in 2008 or later.**
Competitors in Under 17 events must be born in 20010 or later.
Competitors in Cadet events must have been born in 2012 or later.
Competitors in Under 13 events must have been born in 2014 or later.
9. Playing clothing shall consist of a shirt and shorts, trousers, leggings or skirt, or a one-part sports outfit, socks and playing shoes; a sports hijab may also be worn. Other garments shall not be worn during play except with the permission of the referee. The main colour of a shirt, shorts, trousers or skirt, other than sleeves and collar of a shirt, shall be clearly different from that of the ball in use. Any markings or trimming on the front or side of a playing garment and objects such as jewellery worn by a player shall not be so conspicuous or brightly reflecting as to unsight an opponent.
10. No competitor or official shall engage in betting on players or matches.
11. Doping shall not take place either before or during play and doping control tests may take place.
12. All competitors must report to the Control Desk on arrival and must not leave the centre without first notifying the Referee. Players absent when called upon to play are liable to be scratched from their next match.
13. Should there be insufficient entries in any event the Referee reserves the right to cancel that event/merge such event and/or place the entrant in a similar event.
14. The Referee's decision shall be final on points of law, and any question arising not provided for in these regulations, or in any dispute as to the interpretation thereof. Decisions on points of fact by an umpire or assistant umpire appointed by the Referee shall be final.
15. Racket testing may take place.
16. All entries and event details are subject to COVID-related restrictions, or protocols that Table Tennis England may deem necessary. Venues used for events may impose COVID restrictions that go beyond government guidance.
17. All participants and attendees at Table Tennis England events are subject to Table Tennis England Codes of Conduct. See [here](#)
18. TTE, the Organisers and the Referee will not tolerate bad language or verbal abuse of volunteers, officials, staff or venue staff, nor a failure to follow the operational directions of stewards and event staff. Tournament Information

1. The draw will take place on 20th November 2026 at 11 Ward Drive St. Neots PE19 0AP. Once completed, and before the date of the tournament, the draw will be circulated to entrants, no later than the 5th December 2026, and published on the TTE website.
2. Playing Conditions - Play throughout will be on 18 tables: Butterfly Europa (Blue) Nets and posts will be Butterfly Europa. We will be using Butterfly R40 3* White plastic balls. The venue has a wooden sprung floor and general LED 800 lux (min) with lighting 15m (min) above the floor. Court size will be 10m x 5m and 15m (min) from the floor to the ceiling enclosed by surrounds. Scoring machines will be used for all matches.
3. Admission - There will be no charge for admission.
4. Practice - There will be no separate practice facilities. Competitors will be permitted to practice on tables not in use at the discretion of the referee.
5. Car parking is available free of charge.
6. Refreshments will be on sale throughout, with a café serving hot food and drinks on site.
7. Changing facilities including showers for disabled are available on-site.
8. Medals will be given to winners and runners up in every event.
9. If there are any withdrawals, there may be an opportunity for a scratch entry at the referee's discretion.
10. Photo/livestreaming – Cambridge Charity 4 star may be taking photos and live streaming matches during this event, which may include (but is not limited to) using them in our printed and online platforms, social media, press releases and funding applications. If you do not give permission to have photographs and/or videos taken of you (or individuals for whom you are legally responsible), please contact Dan Bullen, email: d.b112@me.com. 11. If it becomes necessary to restrict entries, priority will be given in order of receipt, except that all valid entries from the top 50 TTE ranked males and top 30 TTE ranked females in the event age-group will be accepted based on the rating list current at the closing date.
12. In conjunction with the TTE Child Protection Policy, persons wishing to take photographs or video images must register with the event organiser, producing their professional identification, TTE authorisation or a completed TTE authorisation form.
13. **There are a limited number of available hotels in Oundle itself so book early to avoid disappointment. There are plenty of other hotels in the area but travel distances may increase accordingly**
14. **All players must have at least their family name on the back of their shirt throughout the tournament**

4-star Criteria for Nationals 2026/2027

There are six Cadet & Junior 4* events scheduled for 26/27, with five taking place in the window that will contribute to qualification for the Cadet National Championships 2027 and six in respect of Junior National Championships 2027, as follows:

26-27 Sept: Cleveland 4*

24-25 Oct: Clifedale Chandlers 4*

14-15 Nov: Blackpool 4*

12-13 Dec: Cambridge 4*

16-17 Jan: Joola Plymouth 4*

20-21 Feb: London Academy 4*

Cadet National Championships (06-07 March)

Invites based on December rankings (Published Early Jan) and issued following the Joola Plymouth 4* event

Eligibility to play in 2 of the 5 events above (not including London Academy 4*)

Junior National Championships (17-18 April)

Invites based on January rankings (Published Early February)

Eligibility to play in 2 of the 6 events above

1. All invitees to Cadet National Championships and Junior National Championships 2027 must participate in at least 2 of the 4* events, notwithstanding mitigating circumstances
2. Invitations will be issued to 20 from ranking list + 10 qualifying from 4* events + 2 wildcards (that will default to qualifiers if unused)
3. All boy's and girl's Cadet and Junior 4* winners will receive an automatic invitation if they meet the 2x 4* entry requirement
4. Thereafter, qualifiers determined by 'leader-board' approach; no points (except those for entering) are available for consolation events

- o Enter: 1 point
- o Last 16: +1 point (2 total)
- o Main QF: +1 point (3 total)
- o Main SF: +1 point (4 total)
- o Main R/up: +1 point (5 total)
- o Main Winner: +2 points (6 total; automatic qualification)

Please note that eligibility/ qualifying invites/ leaderboard for Cadet National Championships will include Joola Plymouth 4 and for Junior National Championships will include London Academy 4*, but event results will not be reflected in the national rankings until February and March respectively.*
