TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

- 1 Every entrant must be affiliated as a Compete Member or provide proof of being a member of another National Association in membership of the ITTF in order to gain a reciprocal membership. An entrant who is not a TTE member or is affiliated as a Supporter or Club Play Member may alternately purchase a One-Off Tournament Pass at the time of entry via <https://tabletennisengland.sport80.com/> once this product is launched. It is not possible to obtain the OTTP at the tournament.
2. TTE Regulations Part A (Regulated Competitions) and Part B (Tournament Regulations) apply to the tournament.
3. ITTF Regulations for International Competitions apply to the tournament except where otherwise specified in TTE Regulations Parts A or B, or in this form.
4. Completion and submission of this Entry Form signifies agreement by the entrant to the conditions of the competition, including any variations of ITTF regulations.
5. All matches shall be the best of five games.
6. Preliminary matches will be on a group of 3 basis and the final order in a group shall be determined as per ITTF regulation 3.7.5 for group competitions with the top 2 qualifying for the knockout stage and the bottom player being entered into a plate event so each player is guaranteed 3 matches.
7. Main colour of clothing must be different from colour of ball
8. No competitor or official shall engage in betting on players or matches.
9. All competitors may be required to umpire at least one match in each event entered.
10. Doping shall not take place either before or during play and doping control tests may take place.
11. All competitors must report to the referee on arrival and should not leave the premises without first obtaining the referee's permission. Players absent when called upon to play are liable to be scratched.
12. Should there be insufficient entries in any event the referee reserves the right to cancel that event or merge events or place the entrant in a similar event.
13. The referee's decision shall be final on a point of law and on any question arising not provided for in these regulations.
14. The Prize event is open to competitors who have entered one event at the York One Star Open and is played as a group of 3, ALL 3 players will qualify from the group and play in the knock out stages, all group winners will go into Pool A with the winner receiving £300 and the runner up £150, all group runners up will go into Pool B with the winner receiving £200 and runner up £100 and all third placed players will go into Pool C with the winner receiving £130 and runner up £70. All players entered in the prize event are guaranteed to progress into the knockout stages. There will be no ranking used and an F A cup style draw will take place with no seedings for the draw.
15. All entries and event details are subject to COVID-related restrictions, or protocols and Table Tennis England deem necessary. Venues used for events may impose COVID restrictions that go beyond government guidance.
16. All participants and attendees at Table Tennis England events are subject to Table Tennis England Codes of Conduct. See [here](#).
17. TTE, the Organisers and the Referee will not tolerate bad language or verbal abuse of volunteers, officials, staff or venue staff, nor a failure to follow the operational directions of stewards and event staff. TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

1. Extra Entry Forms can be obtained via post or E Mail from the organiser.
2. The Draw will take place on 7th November 2026.
3. If it becomes necessary to restrict entries, priority will be given in order of receipt.
4. Notification – a list of entries will be put on our website <https://york.ttleagues.com>
5. Practice – There will be no separate practice facilities but competitors will be allowed to practice on tables not currently in use at the discretion of the referee.
6. Admission – There is no entry charge for supporters or spectators.
7. Play will take place on 13 Joola 22mm tables with Joola net and posts, and White Joola 3star poly balls and score indicators for all matches. Court sizes will be at least 9m x 4.57m. Ceiling height is 12m and lights which are LED are 7m above the tables. Playing floor is wood. Courts will be enclosed by surrounds.
8. Car parking is available at and around the venue via NCP and refreshments along with light hot and cold meals will be available from the canteen on the day.
9. There are changing facilities.
